Hazard - unauthorised use of equipment Risk - injury/death	All	Keep axe and saws dry. Never leave out over night. Store in a suitable tent / storage box as appropriate.	
Hazard - axes/saws not in use Risk - injury/death	All	Fit masks or sheaths to axe head and saw blade as appropriate. Do not plant axe into ground. Temporally store the axe securely in the chopping block so the shaft does not cause a trip hazard. Do not leave equipment on the ground as a trip hazard.
