<i>Hazard – something that may cause harm or damage. Risk – the chance of it happening.</i>	<i>Young people, Leaders, Visitors?</i>	<i>Controls – Ways of making the activity safer by removing or reducing the risk from it. For example - you might use a different piece of equipment or you might change the way the activity is carried out.</i>	<i>Keep checking throughout the activity in case you need to change it...or even stop it! This is a great place to add comments which will be used as part of the review.</i>
Hazard - Drop off and Pick up Risk - danger of being knocked over by cars	Leaders, Scouts, Parents	Designate meeting point away from cars	
Hazard - not knowing who is at event Risk - leaving someone behind	Leaders, scouts, Parents	Leader to take register and record on OSM	
Hazard - Uneven ground - danger Risk - twisted ankle, broken bones, cuts	Leaders. Scouts	Leader to advise Scouts of dangers and remind them to be careful when traversing area. Torches to be used, suitable footwear to be worn- advised on OSM First aid kit appropriate for conditions to be available	
Hazard - strangers Risk - abduction	Scouts	all Scouts to stay in minimum of pairs. No one to wander off	
Hazard - not knowing when to come back Risk - Scouts do not return	Scouts	Leaders to have whistle and advise Scouts that when 3 long blasts are blown all are to return to the start location.	
Hazard - Extreme weather Risk - hyperthermia/Sunstroke	Scouts, leaders	Correct clothing for weather to be worn. Wet weather gear or warm clothes as appropriate - Parents to be reminded on OSM. Suncream and hats for hot weather. Drinks to be brought with them or arranged by leaders - advise vis OSM
